READY STEADY TOKYO Cycling Mountain Bike

The Tokyo Organising Committee of the Olympic and Paralympic Games continues with its preparations for the Games and the test event. This most valuable opportunity allows for Tokyo 2020 to confirm and improve the competition and Games operation capabilities in order to ensure a successful operation during Games Time. The primary goals are to test the venue and the full Olympic Mountain Bike course, results technology, command and control protocols as well provide an opportunity to train staff and volunteers.

The Cycling Mountain Bike Test Event is included on the UCI International Mountain Bike Calendar as a class 3 race for men and women elite and will run under UCI regulations.

The Izu Mountain Bike Course will contain a mixture of man-made technical features and it will make full use of the natural environment contained within the venue. The Tokyo 2020 course designer has designed a super compact course that allows the spectators to view it from many different places. The athletes will be tested over undulating terrain comprising of steep climbs, technical descents and a mixture of different surfaces.

Accreditation

Accreditation will be required to access Izu MTB course. Please note that if you arrive on the venue without any accreditation, you will not be permitted access. All attendees must collect their event accreditation from the Sport Information Desk on their arrival on day 1.

Please note - A UCI Rainbow Pass will not be valid for the event.

All NF vehicles wishing to access the event site will need an accredited parking pass, which can also be collected at the Sport Information Desk.

The accreditation collection point will be at Sport Information Desk (for details, see below). The Sport Information Desk will be open at the following times:

Vehicle Access Passes : Every competing NF will be allocated with 2 vehicle passes. Only NF vehicles with appropriate pass will be granted access to the venue and will park in a designated parking location close to the team boxes. All vehicles entering the venue may be subjected to security checks.

Rider Confirmation desk will be located next to the Sport Information Desk in the main building.

Feed and Technical Assistance zone passes: 2 (two) feed zone passes per nation will be issued. NF's must collect the Feed and Technical Assistance passes from the Rider Confirmation desk during the times mentioned above.

Note: Please be aware that entering the venue before Thursday October 3 will not be possible due to the on-going construction work. Every effort has been made to make the venue available to you all, but only on the given days and timings mentioned above. If you try to enter the venue outside of these timings, you will be turned away.

On this first day, an image use agreement must be signed by everyone who will be attending to the event authorizing the TOCOG2020 to publish photos or videos.

Facilities

Every competing Nation will be allocated 1 (one) 3mtr x 3mtr Team box each. *Requests for more space will be approved if requested in writing in advance of the event. These team boxes will be sign posted and located inside the main building, and each box will be identified by a NOC code. A limited amount of chairs will also be made available, and tables if needed, again please request these in writing before the event.

Other facilities at the competition venue will include:


- Bicycle maintenance and repair services Shimano Neutral Services
- A Bicycle wash area will be provided
- Warm up rollers a limited number will be provided at the Sport Equipment desk on a first come first served basis
- A Mixed Zone area where accredited media may conduct interviews with athletes after competition will be set up after the finish line
- Wi fi Will be available at the Wifi spot on the 2nd floor only
- Sport Information Desk For all accreditation, rider registration, general information, start lists, results etc
- Medical A medical treatment room will be in the main building. Medical teams will also be located at seven points along the FOP
- A Doping Control station will be located at the Velodrome if required.
- Changing rooms on the second floor of Teams area and showers at the gym building 100m away from teams area (please refer to map on page 11)
- Bottles of water will be available on training days and competition day. Competing NFs / Teams are also permitted to bring their own food and liquid for personal use on to the venue, but there are no refrigerators available for the storage of any perishable items.




Note: smoking at the venue is not allowed, unless in the designated areas.

- The Victory ceremony will take place after each race. NF clothing must be worn on the podium.
- The Location of the podium and preparation area will all be confirmed at the team managers meeting on October 5th.
- A small mixed zone will be set up after the finish line where interviews and pictures can take place. It will be optional for athletes to participate.

*Accommodation and transport costs are under each National Federations financial responsibility.


Hotels can be booked via our appointed Travel Agency; Tobu Top Tours Co Ltd. *3 hotels have been identified for the national cycling federations to use during the test event. These have been selected to meet the needs of a cycling federation during their stay. They will all have on-site parking, single room, twin rooms or 4 and 6 person rooms available, WIFI, bike wash facilities, buffet style dining for breakfast and dinner with options for western / Asian style food. If you would like to book one of these hotels, please make contact with the appointed travel agency (For more information, see page 18).

Note* Please note that a dedicated shuttle bus service will be provided, but this can only be used by the NFs who have booked their hotel accommodation with the appointed travel agency.

National Cycling Federations can also choose to make their own travel / accommodation arrangements – Many quality hotels are within a 1 hour drive of the venue, in the areas of Atami, Mishima, Shuzenji, Ito, Numazu, Izu Village etc.

For all the participants that are nationals from countries who need a visa to enter Tokyo, please contact TOBU TOP TOURS CO.,LTD. Tokyo2020 will provide invitation letters that must be submitted with the visa application at the chosen Japanese Consulate/Embassy abroad.

To request an Invitation Letter, please send an email to mtb@tobutoptours.co.jp with a list of the applicants, and an application form will be provided.

Prior to deciding for your travel, we recommend you check the Visa and Work Permit. Please see the below website for further information. In this website you will find information on which type of Visa you will need to bear. You will also be able to find instructions on how to apply for your visa.

Wireless devices and radio

All wireless devices need to be declared and approved for use at Izu MTB Course. Unapproved devices will not be allowed on site. This will not apply to mobile phones, laptops, Bluetooth headsets but will apply to everything else, including walkie-talkies/ PMR/LMR/ Wi-fi access points and hubs.
