

MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Members,

Last month's newsletter was sent out a few days before the Women's Championships of Afghanistan. This event was a great success and very emotional. Fifty Afghan women took part in the 57km race that started and finished at the UCI World Cycling Centre in Aigle, Switzerland.

As well as the sporting performances of the winners, the Championships on 23 October were marked by a very human aspect. The young participants were visibly moved to have the chance to race together, after thinking it would no longer be possible given the dangers they had

encountered cycling in Afghanistan before their evacuation. Now living in different host countries, they were delighted to spend a week together training at the UCI WCC in the lead up to these unique Championships.

A few days later I was in Paris for the unveiling of the routes for the 2023 Tour de France and Tour de France Femmes. There is always an atmosphere of excitement around this announcement and this year was no exception. We can already look forward to two magnificent stage races through France next July!

We have staged three more UCI World Championships since the last newsletter, starting with the UCI Para-cycling Track World Championships in St-Quentin-en-Yvelines (France) from 20 to 23 October, followed two weeks later by the UCI Indoor Cycling World Championships in Ghent, Belgium. Both were an undeniable success, with world records tumbling in St-Quentin-en-Yvelines, and stunning cycle-ball and artistic cycling performances in Ghent.

I had great pleasure attending the UCI Urban Cycling World Championships that took place in Abu Dhabi (United Arab Emirates) from 9 to 13 November. After their cancellation in 2020 and a modified format in 2021 due to the Covid-19 pandemic, it was wonderful to see our UCI World Championships for BMX Freestyle Park, BMX Freestyle Flatland and trials come together again. Asia's first UCI Bike City provided a majestic backdrop for the competitions, and for a meeting of our UCI Athletes' Commission.

More than 80 Sport Directors spent a week in Aigle for our annual Sport Director course leading to an exam to obtain the UCI Sport Director Diploma. It was a pleasure to welcome these men and women – many of them former pro riders – to the UCI World Cycling Centre to obtain their official certification.

As you know, the 2023 UCI Cycling World Championships will take place in Glasgow and across Scotland from 3 to 13 August next year. I was pleased to be able to talk about this inaugural event, alongside its Chair Paul Bush, during the Host City 2022 conference in Glasgow last week. Covering all aspects of hosting and delivering events, the two-day conference brought together representatives of cities, marketing organisations, rightsholders, organising committees and suppliers.

More recently, I was in Montreal on 18 November for a meeting of the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Foundation Board. I continue to value my position among the 38 board members who represent the Olympic Movement and public authorities. Cycling and the UCI have been at the forefront of the fight against doping, and I appreciate having the opportunity to work with other sports in this important domain.

Call for bids: the UCI reveals the list of UCI World Championships that it will award at its next Congress

The Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI) has published the list of UCI World Championships that are open for bidding and whose hosts will be announced at the next UCI Congress, in August 2023, during the UCI Cycling Championships in Glasgow, and across Scotland.

The events that will be awarded are:

- 2024 UCI Masters Mountain Bike Marathon World Championships
- 2024 and 2025 UCI Masters Mountain Bike World Championships
- 2025 and 2026 UCI Masters Cyclo-cross World Championships

- 2026 and 2027 UCI Masters Track World Championships
- 2024, 2025 and 2026 UCI Indoor Cycling World Championships
- 2025, 2026 and 2028 UCI Urban Cycling World Championships
- 2025 and 2026 UCI Para-cycling Track World Championships
- 2026 UCI Para-cycling Road World Championships
- 2026 UCI Junior Track World Championships
- 2028 UCI Mountain Bike Marathon World Championships
- 2028 UCI Gravel World Championships
- 2028 UCI Cyclo-cross World Championships
- 2028 UCI Track World Championships
- 2028 UCI BMX Racing World Championships

ROAD

Registration of UCI Women's WorldTeams, UCI WorldTeams, UCI ProTeams, UCI Women's Continental Teams and UCI Continental Teams

The registration of UCI professional teams is ongoing, in collaboration with the appointed auditor, PwC. In accordance with the UCI Regulations, the teams with a compliant file as of 15 November 2022 will be registered; the others as well as the licence applicants will be heard by the UCI Licence Commission.

Regarding the UCI Women's Continental Teams and UCI Continental Teams, we kindly remind that the compliant files of these teams must have been submitted by the National Federations by 10 November.

The UCI is currently checking the submitted files. On this matter, we strongly recommend National Federations and concerned teams to regularly connect to the UCI DataRide – Teams platform to check the file status. If requests of clarifications are made or elements are rejected, it is recommended to act as soon as possible in order not to delay the publication of the team name within the list of the registered teams.

Event Safety Manager course

In January and February 2023, the UCI will host the very first UCI Event Safety Manager course at the UCI World Cycling Centre in Aigle, Switzerland. The course is compulsory for all UCI Women's WorldTour, UCI WorldTour and UCI ProSeries organisers,

- Course 1 between 16 and 18 January 2023 in French with translation to Spanish or;
- Course 2 between 19 and 21 January in English with translation to Italian.

UCI Track Equipment Registration Procedure for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games

The UCI Track Equipment Registration for the Paris 2024 Olympic Games shall require National Federations to register the equipment they intend to use in Paris.

For the sake of clarity, this registration procedure will only apply for the track discipline and shall not be applied to other disciplines of the Paris 2024 Olympic Games or the Paris 2024 Paralympic Games.

All track equipment that will be used during the Paris 2024 Games must be checked and registered by the UCI during one of the three 2023 Tissot UCI Track Nations Cups or during the UCI Track World Championships in Glasgow, Great Britain.

2023 UCI BMX Racing Teams

The 2023 UCI BMX Racing Team registration is open to register a UCI BMX Racing Team for 2023.

There are many benefits in registering a team, namely:

- Allocation of one Team Bib during UCI BMX Racing World Cup events.
- Online registration to UCI BMX Racing World Cup events for riders in a UCI BMX team.
- UCI BMX Racing World Cup rainbow passes. The same number of passes (as defined in the series parameters within each season) available to National Teams shall be made available for UCI BMX Racing Teams. For avoidance of doubt, all riders entered by the team are accredited for each UCI BMX Racing World Cup event by virtue of their race entry and are not given rainbow passes.
- The right to a team tent and parking at UCI BMX Racing World Cup events under the same conditions and prices as those set for national teams by the event organisers.
- Access to the UCI Arbitral Board for their riders, their paying agents and the UCI BMX Racing Team's principal partners.
- Two sporting accreditations and one team bib during the UCI BMX Racing World Championships.

<u>Upgrade in the Women Elite category:</u>

Following in the footsteps of Kata Vas (HUN – Team SD Worx) in 2021, Fem Van Empel (NED – Pauwels Sauzen Bingoal) has been upgraded to the Women Elite category for cyclo-cross events as of 31 October 2022 and for the rest of her career.

These upgrades have been approved on an individual and exceptional basis by the UCI for two riders who are in the Under 23 age category, at their request and at the request of their teams and their National Federations.

Please note that this upgrade applies only to cyclo-cross events.

2023 UCI Cyclo-cross World Cup Championships

The 2023 UCI Cyclo-cross World Championships will take place on 3, 4 and 5 February 2023 in Hoogerheide (Netherlands).

The cyclo-cross team relay will make its debut on the official programme in 2023. The first UCI world title in the event will go to the six members of the team winning this new race on the programme.

International Commissaire course planning until 2026

The Commissaires' Commission at its most recent meeting in Amsterdam, Netherlands, approved the new International Commissaire course planning until 2026. There will be annual application procedures inviting National Federations to submit their candidates as per article **1.1.054**. of the UCI regulations.

Additionally, the UCI Commissaires' Unit, in cooperation with Continental Confederations, will offer multiple Elite National Commissaire courses on different continents. More information about the application process will be provided in early 2023. One of the objectives is to extend the pool of Elite National Commissaires within cycling emerging countries where the number of international races has increased, as well as to increase the pool of potential candidates for the upcoming International Commissaire courses.

MEDICAL

Mandatory Medical Monitoring for mountain bike, track and BMX disciplines

We kindly remind you that as per §3 of Part XIII Medical Rules of the UCI Regulations, the National Federations are responsible for the organisation and implementation of Mandatory Medical Monitoring of the following riders:

- **Mountain bike**: the first 100 men and the first 40 women in the UCI individual classification on the 31 December of the preceding year;
- **Track**: the first 100 men and the first 40 women in the UCI individual classification on the 31 December of the preceding year;
- **BMX**: the first 50 men and the first 20 women of the UCI individual classifications on the 31 December of the preceding year.

For 2023, the list of riders will be published in January 2023 in the medical section of the UCI website. There, you can find not only the lists of riders to be followed but also the detailed rules with the lists of medical exams and the official declarations for each discipline to be filled in and sent to the UCI.

Sport-related concussion assessment

With the aim of improving the diagnosis and recognition of sport-related concussions, the UCI recently published Concussion assessment pocket cards. These practical cards for road and track disciplines contain a fast protocol to quickly assess the suspicion of a traumatic brain injury. They are intended for use by medical and non-medical personnel surrounding the riders immediately after a fall. PDF versions of these cards are available on the UCI website. If you are interested, you can contact us, and we will send you a few cards to distribute among your staff.

Pocket cards specifically designed for the Road and Track events are currently available in English. They will soon be available in French and Spanish. Specific pocket cards for MTB and BMX will also be available soon.

CYCLING FOR ALL

Watch the 2022 UCI Mobility & Bike City Forum

The 4th edition of the UCI Mobility & Bike City Forum successfully took place on 27–28 October 2022. Cycling leaders, advocates, mobility experts, industry representatives and policy makers

were among some 110 participants who gathered in Glasgow (Scotland) which was awarded the UCI Bike City Label in 2019, for two days of interactive presentations, exchanges and visits. Participants had an opportunity to learn first-hand how cycling – both as a sport and form of transport – continues to promote positive impact, social inclusion, public health and the fight against climate change.

UCI Cycling for All & Sustainable Cycling Commission President Tony Mitchell delivered the opening speech, alongside Glasgow City Leader Councillor Susan Aitken, British Cycling Policy Advisor Chris Boardman, and 2023 UCI Cycling World Championships CEO Trudy Lindblade. The UCI Mobility and Bike City Forum's keynote speech was given by British rider Alex Dowsett. A professional rider, two-time Giro d'Italia stage winner, former holder of the UCI Hour Record timed by Tissot, cycling coach, and founder of the Little Bleeders charity, Alex Dowsett shared how haemophilia led him into a life in cycling.

The UCI Bike City Label trophies were awarded to representatives of the two regions that joined the UCI Bike City & Region network in 2022: the province of Noord-Brabant (the Netherlands) and the canton of Vaud (Switzerland). Meanwhile, representatives from the Australian city of Wollongong, which was awarded the UCI Bike City Label in 2021 and hosted last year's UCI Road World Championships, detailed its cycling for all initiatives.

Expert panels and presentations held throughout the day dealing with topics including cycling cities; cycling and climate change; the cycling industry and socio-economic development; and sport as a tool for social inclusion. Key messages included:

- the power of sport to enable cities to reinvent themselves and encourage social change
- the importance of political will and multi-sectorial partnerships to strengthen cycling
- the need for sustained investment in and recognition of cycling and active travel as a solution to climate change
- the potential of academic research to strengthen the promotion of cycling.

Attendees also learned of inspiring global transformational societal change achieved through cycling NGOs, events and charities.



BICI - A new grant programme for cycling infrastructure in cities

On Monday 10 October 2022 at CityLab in Amsterdam, Michael R. Bloomberg and Janette Sadik-Khan announced the **Bloomberg Initiative for Cycling Infrastructure (BICI)**, a competitive grant programme that will award 10 cities up to \$1 million each to accelerate delivery of largescale cycling network infrastructure projects. Cities around the world that are building or want to build outstanding cycling infrastructure are eligible for this programme. Applications will be accepted until 3 February 2023. <u>Visit the BICI website to learn more and apply</u>.
