MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Members.

The UCI Cyclo-cross World Championships and the first UCI Management Committee meeting of the year launched the month of February.

Our Management Committee meeting in Hoogerheide, the Netherlands, on 2 and 3 February was, as always, extremely productive. This year we discussed at length the very important and delicate subject of sanctions taken against Russia and Belarus. After much consideration, our members unanimously adopted a resolution which is in line with the International Olympic Committee (IOC) Executive Board meetings of 25 January 2023 and 7 December 2022, as well as the 11th Olympic Summit of 9 December 2022. I invite you to read details of the resolution in our press release published on the UCI website.

At the same time, Hoogerheide hosted a fantastic edition of the UCI Cyclo-cross World Championships which included many highlights, not least the award of the first rainbow jerseys for the team relay. Team victory for the hosts the Netherlands set the tone for an incredible weekend of individual racing that crowned six extremely worthy UCI World Champions.

Just last Saturday, on 18 February, we crowned two more 2023 UCI World Champions, for cycling esports. The third edition of the UCI Cycling Esports World Championships saw the introduction of an exciting new format that included three short and explosive events, each eliminating a proportion of the peloton, with only ten men and ten women making the final event – the Podium. The racing took place on a new specifically-built Scotland map, inspired by the Scottish landscape and the city of Glasgow, which will play host to the inaugural 2023 UCI Cycling World Championships in August.

Indeed, we have now passed the "six months to go" milestone before these inaugural UCI Cycling World Championships, and excitement is building. As you know, it is my firm desire to see the participation of all 202 of our National Federations, and at a recent meeting of the Solidarity and Emerging Cycling Countries Commission, members looked at how we could support National Federations from Groups 3 and 4 to attend this fantastic event in Glasgow and across Scotland. The Commission met on 25 January, and it was a pleasure to welcome nine of the members to the UCI headquarters in Aigle in person to discuss different solidarity projects in support of National Federations and Continental Confederations. As stated in our Agenda 2030, our Federations are central to the development of cycling worldwide, and the UCI remains very much at your service.

2023 UCI Cycling World Championships - Glasgow and across Scotland

2024 UCI Emerging Cycling Countries World Championships

The 2024 UCI Emerging Cycling Countries World Championships will be held between 2 and 10 March 2024 in Cairo, Egypt.

The disciplines which will feature are track, road (road race, time trial), BMX Racing and mountain bike (cross-country Olympic, short track).

There will be two categories: Women Over 17 and Men Over 17.

Equipment

In general, the equipment regulations for each of the included disciplines shall apply.

In the case of the road discipline, in keeping with the nature of the event, each rider who participates in the time trial must use the same bicycle as the one used in the road race, without modification. As such, bicycles specifically designed for use in time trials shall not be permitted.

The same rule shall apply for track time trial events such as the kilometre time trial.

Eligibility criteria

The eligibility criteria have been approved by the UCI Management Committee and will be as follows:

Nations in groups 3 and 4 of the UCI National Federations' classification for the period
 2023 - 2025 are eligible to participate only when they did not qualify or only qualified in

a single discipline for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games. In case of participation in a single discipline at Tokyo 2020, they will not be eligible to participate in that discipline during the 2024 UCI Emerging Cycling Countries World Championships.

- Nations in groups 3 and 4 of the UCI National Federations' classification for the period 2023 - 2025 are non-eligible when they participated in two or more disciplines at Tokyo 2020.
- Nations in group 2 of the same economic classification with a population of less than 1,000,000 inhabitants will also be allowed to participate, subject to the same restriction related to qualification for the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games.
- No nations from group 1 in the same economic classification are eligible.

All teams must ensure that their information as well as the names of their riders and Sport Directors are duly published on the UCI website before going to any event. Should there be an issue, please contact road@uci.ch with enough time ahead of the event to ensure a solution can be found.

The teams must also ensure that the team members have a valid 2023 UCI licence, indicating the correct role and team.

In addition, for all UCI events, the teams must only wear the jerseys approved on the UCI DataRide – Teams platform. We invite the teams for which the jersey has not already been validated to get back to the UCI as soon as possible. Participation of UCI Continental Teams and UCI Cyclo-cross Professional Teams in UCI ProSeries events

(Article 2.1.005 of the UCI Regulations)

The table with the list of teams authorised to participate in UCI ProSeries events is available on the <u>UCI website</u> and will be updated regularly during the year. Please contact <u>road@uci.ch</u> if you have any doubt in this matter. No derogation will be granted for teams not respecting the conditions and timeline.

Participation rules

(Articles 2.1.005bis and 2.2.001 of the UCI Regulations)

As per article 2.2.001 of the UCI Regulations, "riders belonging to a team registered with the UCI with the same paying agent or main partner may not compete in the same race except in the case of an individual event". Likewise, all the affiliated club teams with the same paying agent, team representative or main sponsor as a UCI Team must be declared to the relevant

National Federation. We invite all the National Federations which have not yet informed the UCI to do so as soon as possible by contacting <u>road@uci.ch</u>. We kindly ask that National Federations inform the UCI immediately of any changes during the year.

Finally, in order to benefit from the participation rule mentioned in article 2.1.005bis of the UCI Regulations for the development teams of a UCI WorldTeam or UCI ProTeam, teams must be managed by the same paying agent, with a common identity (see articles 2.13.218–219; 2.15.242–243 and 2.16.055–056).

The list of teams concerned by the provisions of articles 2.1.005bis and/or 2.2.001 of the UCI Regulations for the 2023 season is available on the <u>UCI website</u>.

Mandatory invitations to road race (art. 2.1.007bis, 2.14.020, 2.14.021, 2.14.038 and 2.14.051 of the UCI Regulations)

The <u>list of mandatory invitations</u> extended to teams for road events is published on the page dedicated to the UCI Regulations on the UCI website. We kindly request that this updated list is used.

Prize money platform

During January and February, the UCI WorldTour, UCI Women's WorldTour, UCI ProSeries and Class 1 organisers for both men and women events must update (or create if needed) their account on the centralised prize money management platform, so that prize money can be paid in accordance with the UCI Regulations (art. 1.2.071). No payment of prize money for these events is allowed outside of the platform. Any contravention to the UCI Regulations shall be sanctioned.

During February and March, the UCI WorldTeams, UCI Women's WorldTeams, UCI ProTeams, UCI Continental Teams, UCI Women's Continental Teams, National Teams, UCI Cyclo-cross Professional Teams and their riders must also update (or create if needed) their account on the **centralised prize money management platform**, so that prize money can be paid in accordance with the UCI Regulations (art. 1.2.071).

Any prize money which will be due to teams not included in the above list (i.e.: club teams, UCI Cyclo-cross Teams, regional teams) will be transferred to the National Federation of the team concerned, which will then proceed with the payment of the prize money.

Update of Covid-19 protocol - Organisers

We kindly request that you acquaint yourselves with the most recent UCI <u>press release</u> on this matter. Please note that the updated protocol is also available <u>on the UCI website</u>.

We remind organisers that they must provide the following information on the <u>dedicated</u> <u>platform</u> set up by the UCI, <u>at least 14 days before the start of their event</u>:

- 1. The phase of the pandemic as the competition approaches, including the values of the two criteria reported in paragraph D1, as well as the "colour" of the geographical area, defined by the following criteria:
 - a. The number of confirmed Covid cases per 100,000 people and per week.
 - b. The effective reproductive rate (*Re*) and an assessment of the severity of the pandemic in the geographical area according to a colour code (green = low risk, orange = moderate risk, red = high risk).
- 2. A summary of the risk-mitigation measures put in place.

Qualification system

The qualification system for the 2023 UCI Cycling World Championships - Road has been published on the UCI website.

The nations interested in taking part in the team time trial – mixed relay must request an invitation by sending an email to rwc@uci.ch before 15 May 2023.

The allocated quota places for the other events will be published on 23 June 2023. The deadline for confirming the (total or partial) use of the quotas for the Men Elite road race event is **30 June 2023**. Online registration begins on 27 June 2023 at 12:00 (GMT+2) on the dedicated UCI online platform: http://regonline.uci.ch.

In all cases, the UCI must receive registration enrolments before the deadline set out in article 9.2.004 of the UCI Regulations. All applications must be received before **28 July 2023 at 12:00 (GMT+2)**. After this deadline, enrolments will no longer be accepted.

2023 UCI Cycle-ball World Cup

The first 2023 UCI Cycle-ball World Cup took place on 12 February in Osaka, Japan.

The winner of the first round and current leader of the series are Timon and Yannick Fröhlich from Altdorf (SUI). Second place went to Markus Dörr and Luca Kovacevic from Germany, followed by the local heroes Murakami Yusuke and Takahashi Yuma on third place.

During the event, the Japanese Cycling Federation organised an exhibition game of two female cycle-ball teams, which was a great presentation of their efforts for gender equity within the sport and an important step into a new direction.

Report any concerns on REVEAL - International Testing Agency's reporting platform



Have you ever seen, heard, experienced, or suspected a doping offence and did not know how and to whom you should report it? REVEAL is a platform developed by the International Testing Agency (ITA) that helps you to do so. It offers the sport community the opportunity to report confidentially and anonymously on a secure platform any doping offences or any suspicions to the ITA. In this way, you actively support the investigation of anti-doping rule violations or criminal behaviour.

Every piece of information is crucial in the fight for Clean Sport and we count on you to play a role and report any anti-doping concerns. Any information provided helps us to uncover doping, to catch cheaters and allows us to move closer to a clean and fair playing field for all.

If you are wondering if your information is important enough, if you have doubts regarding the relevance of your information or if you are afraid of sharing it, please be assured that the Intelligence & Investigations department of the ITA will treat your information in a confidential and sensible manner.

SPOTLIGHT ON THE UCL CYCLING ESPORTS WORLD

CHAMPIONSHIPS

The third edition of the UCI Cycling Esports World Championships on 18 February took on a new, innovative format that was popular with the athletes and spectacular for the spectators. Three short, explosive events - the Punch, the Climb and the Podium - gradually whittled the field down as the racing in the new Scotland virtual world became increasingly intense.

In both the women's and men's competition, only the top 30 from the Punch race qualified for the Climb, with the rest being eliminated from the competition. Athletes had to finish in the top ten of the Climb to go through to the Podium event and battle for the rainbow jersey. The Podium event saw one rider eliminated through each archway until only three remained to fight for the podium and the title of 2023 UCI World Champion.

All eyes will be focused on Rwanda when the UCI Road World Championships are staged in the Central African country in 2025. It will also be an opportunity for the athletes from this "land of a thousand hills" to show the rest of the world just what they are capable of. Simon Hupperetz has been appointed Rwanda Development Project Lead and is determined to see the country's young cyclists do more than simply participate in this historic event.
